Library Lecture to Focus On Black Nationalist John Edward Bruce

Yonkers Riverfront Library and the Yon-Yonkers Riverfront Library and the Yon-kers Historical Society will present a lecture titled "John Edward Bruce: Black Nationalist: 1856-1924" by Dr. William Seraile on Satur-day, July 13 at 2 p.m. in fourth-floor Yonkers Room, at One Larkin Center. A prolific writer and major figure in Af-rican American history and politics, John Ed-ward Bruce witnessed the last days of Ameri-ward Bruce witnessed the last days of Ameri-
